

Sunday Windsor Guided Walking Tour

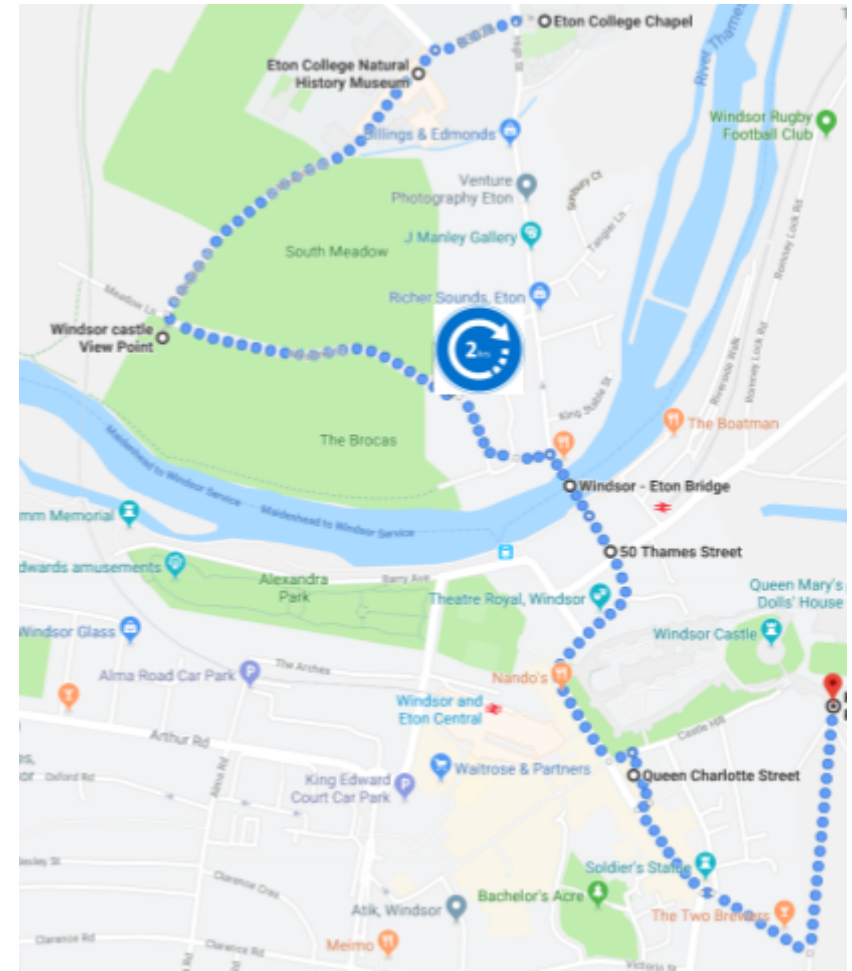

Eton College - Eton was founded in 1440 by King Henry VI as “Kynge’s College of Our Ladye of Eton besyde Windesore” to provide free education to 70 poor boys who would then go on to King’s College, Cambridge, which he founded 1441.

Eton College Chapel - Construction of the chapel, originally intended to be slightly over twice its current length was stopped hurriedly, but by this time the chapel in its current form and the lower storeys of the current cloisters, including College Hall, had been completed.



Eton College Natural History Museum - The museum contains many stuffed animals, plants, fossils and insects. It is located by the archway into the Queens Quad, beside Lower Chapel at the school.

Windsor Castle ViewPoint - At the top of snow hill you will be treated with one of the best views in Berkshire, and the South East of England. Not only do you get a jaw-dropping view of the castle, but you can see for literally miles around - including as far as central London and the Thames Valley.



Windsor-Eton Bridge - The Windsor Bridge or Windsor Town Bridge, an iron and granite arch bridge over the River Thames, this river runs between Royal Windsor and the village of Eton. The bridge carries pedestrian and cycle traffic, and crosses the Thames just above Romney Lock.



Windsor Castle - Windsor Castle, English royal residence that stands on a ridge at the northeastern edge of the district of Windsor and Maidenhead in the county of Berkshire, England. The castle occupies 13 acres (5 hectares) of ground above the south bank of the River Thames. Windsor Castle comprises two quadrilateral-shaped building complexes, or courts, that are separated by the Round Tower.



Windsor and Royal Borough Museum - The collection relates to the history of Windsor, and other towns and villages across the Borough in East Berkshire.

High St - A string of antiques shops, small galleries and boutiques line the winding road that runs from Eton Bridge to the college. Highlights include contemporary art at the Barker Gallery; the wonderfully dusty Eton Antique Bookshop; the Eton College gift shop (teddy bears and tea towels); and modern sculpture and jewellery at Turner and Thom.



Home Park - Home Park Public forms part of the Crown Estate, lying in the setting of Windsor Castle. The Park formed part of the private grounds of Windsor Castle until 1851, when Queen Victoria authorised and commanded that the land should be used for the recreation of the inhabitants of Windsor. While exploring the park you will experience part of the Long Walk.
